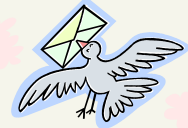

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING – VARIANCE

Notice is hereby given that the Mill City Planning Commission will hold a public hearing at its regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, October 20, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. at the City Hall, 444 1st Avenue, in Mill City. The Commission will consider the following proposals:

- (1) File No. 2021-08 Lot Width Variance
SW Spring St. and SW 8th Avenue, Mill City, Oregon
T9S R3E Section 30DC, Tax Lot 01100

The City of Mill City has received a land use application from Glen Kent and Doug Doty, 250 Sunset LLC, requesting the City approve a variance to the 70' minimum lot width requirement for four lots within a proposed subdivision at the corner of SW 8th Avenue and SW Spring Street in Mill City, Oregon.

The applicants have presented a concept plan for a 7-lot subdivision on a vacant 1.39-acre tract of land at the corner of SW 8th Avenue and SW Spring Street. Before filing a subdivision application, the applicants request the City approve a variance to the minimum lot width requirement in Section 17.12.040 of the Mill City Zoning Code to allow for the development of up to 7 lots on the 1.39-acre parcel. Four of the parcels are proposed with lot widths less than the required minimum 70' lot width. The property is zoned Single-Family Residential (R-1).

The hearing will be held at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 20, 2021 -at the City Hall, 444 S. First Ave-

nue, Mill City, Oregon. The application, decision criteria and staff report will be available at City Hall seven days prior to the hearing. Any person wishing to provide testimony must address the decision criteria. The Planning Commission will make its decision based on the criteria for a variance. The criteria are found in the Mill City Zoning Code, Title 17, Chapter 17.12 "R-1 Residential Zone" and Chapter 17.56 "Variances". Searchable City Code can be viewed under "Documents" at the City of Mill City website: <http://www.ci.mill-city.or.us/> Failure to raise an issue precludes appeal and failure to specify to which criterion the comment is directed precludes appeal based on that criterion.

City Hall is accessible to persons with disabilities. Please call City Hall (503-897-2302) by noon the day before the meeting if you need an interpreter for the hearing impaired or any other special accommodation. **MILL CITY VOLUNTEER FIRE
DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCES
OPENING OF BURN SEASON**

Burn Season Opens October 1st—
Due to the recent rains the fall
backyard burning season will open
on October 1st. The Mill City Volun-
teer Fire Department wants you
to remember to always call before
you burn. The burn information
number is 1-877-982-0011 and is
updated daily at 8am. Call this
number before you burn, they will
tell you if it is a burn day and the
hours that you can burn for that
day.

Burn days are regulated by the DEQ
each day and there will be some
days that burning is not allowed, so
make sure you call each day that
you want to burn. Make sure that
you do not leave your burn pile un-

attended and that you have a water
source readily available in case it
tries to get out of control. Keep your
pile small; don't try to burn huge
piles that will burn for days at a
time, which is how they get out of
control. Make sure that you are only
burning legal items on your burn
pile; backyard debris is all you
should have on there, no plastics or
garbage. For a brochure on what is
legal to burn you can stop by the fire
hall; 400 S 1st Avenue, Mill City,
Monday - Friday 9am- 3pm.
