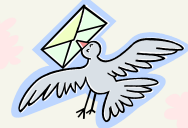

HAVE YOU FILED YOUR CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR RECREATIONAL VEHICLE USE? DISPLACED BY THE FIRE AND NEED A PLACE TO PARK AN RV?

The City of Mill City adopted a temporary code to allow those displaced by the fires to temporarily reside in recreational vehicles through a permitting process.

Staff identified RV's throughout town and mailed the permit application to each property owner. These applications, along with a \$25.00 fee are required if you are currently housing a displaced resident or are looking to do so.

Mill City has also constructed a temporary RV site on the north side of town.

There are still spaces available for those in need. To qualify an application is required along with proof of loss of residence. Additional requirements will be necessary once approved to move into the site.

Notice of the first budget meeting must be published in the paper (or mailed or hand-delivered) twice at least seven (7) days apart and not sooner than five (5) days nor longer than thirty (30) days prior to the first meeting. Notice of subsequent meetings do not have to be published but must be posted, either individually or in one single posting, and notice must comply with ORS 294.406.

If public testimony is not received at the first meeting, along with the budget message, opportunity must be provided at subsequent meetings. Notice of at least the first meeting at which public testimony will be received must be published. Notice of meetings should include a statement regarding handicapped accessibility.

**MILL CITY PLANNING COMMISSION
NOTICE OF VACANCY**

The City of Mill City has three (3) vacancies on the Mill City Planning Commission, as of June 30, 2021. Interested residents must submit an application outlining their interest in the position by May 14, 2021.

The basic eligibility requirement is residence within the city limits or within two (2) miles of City limits. The Planning Commission meets once per month on the 3rd Friday of the month at 9:00a.m. In the case of a public hearing the meetings are changed to the third Tuesday of the month at 6:30p.m. Meetings are held at City Hall; 444 S 1st Avenue. Additional work sessions are scheduled as needed. The Planning Commission reviews all land use applications and develop-

ment proposals. They also consider amendments and updates to the city's zoning ordinance and comprehensive plan. Applications are available at City Hall or on our website: www.ci.mill-city.or.us.

**BRIDGE/ROAD CLOSURE
UPDATES**

The work on the vehicle bridge is nearing its end. This means that both travel lanes will be open for use.

The next phase of the TIGER Grant Project is the rehabilitation of the Historic Railroad Bridge, which will be closing to the public on March 1st. Pedestrians will need to use the sidewalk on the vehicle bridge.

On March 8th SW Broadway Street will be fully closed for reconstruction work. This is anticipated to be approximately four months. Detours using SW 11th Avenue to SW Kingwood Avenue will be posted.

Approximately March 30th the vehicle bridge will again be one lane traffic in order to accommodate equipment needed for the Railroad Bridge project.
